Lilac background: Deadkeys

D1 = Main JaghbUni deadkey. Press this and following letter to produce additional characters, such as:

c (č), s (š), z (ž), y (ÿ), r (ý), o (ď), p (b), also some further loose diacritics: g : caron, x : curve, H : two dots, v : line above, u : line below, a : acute, q : grave, M : high dot above.

D2 = Hausa-Fulani deadkey (not Bairuni / KoufrUni, but other Unicode fonts, k (k̂), b (b̂), d (d̂)).
